

Outcomes from WBSC Congress, WBSC Europe and ESF Meetings:

A few important meetings happened over the past 2 months. The most important was the 3rd WBSC Congress in Sakai, where I was pleased to see many of you were present – news <u>here</u>. Let me touch on two things here, which I am still thinking about even though the Congress is over. The first thing is the number of teams competing at Softball World Cups. Even though World Cups are surely our pinnacle events and the quality of the games is important to promote our sport as a top event, World Cup itself has also other values, like globalism and advertising of softball. World Cup is the strongest tool to spread the name of softball over all continents and largely over societies, sponsors, fans and stakeholders. Almost all other team sports, like basketball, volleyball, handball and others increase the number of teams. Unfortunately, softball is going in the opposite direction and are decreasing the number of the teams for World Cups. This decision shows a losing of interest for our sport. I can understand that it is not easy to find organizers, but I am sure we can do it when we cooperate.



Which brings me to my second issue I would like to share with you. The proposal to decrease the number of teams was only brought to us during the WBSC board meeting, therefore we had no opportunity prepare arguments, based on relevant sources and considerations, in order to reach a common agreement about the future goals and hereby easier acceptance of the decisions of the

board. In general, we did not receive any materials in advance for any of the meetings, which made it impossible to come informed and prepared.

The WBSC Europe Board Meeting discussed mainly about common events, as Super6 and Baseball5 and our Constitution. Several views and opinions have been put forward regarding the structure of WBSC Europe. I sincerely hope that all will be finalized in Vilnius and I believe that the strategic common goals will take precedence over personal or NFs ambitions. It is very important that the final Constitution will present a unified Europe, that are working together for common goals. Surely, we will not agree about everything, which is understandable due to big differences in the European countries. But it is crucial that we are able to agree about strategic matters and stand together as one body. Otherwise, the European position in the world will be weakened. We will call a Presidential Meeting in Vilnius to discuss this topic.

ESF or European Softball Division had an executive board meeting last weekend in Rome. We met with FIBS representatives and with NOC President Giovanni Malago, which was very important politically, to show our support. We discussed about the competition situation for 2020 – see below – and how to run our competitions in a better professional way. We moved on medialization of our events and about structuring. We also had on the table proposals by NFs, which will be finally discussed at the Technical and Competition Meeting in Vilnius. We brought up again the eligibility of players and also teams, which finally be discussed at special panel in Vilnius.

Competitions 2020:

The <u>European Calendar of 2020</u> is approved. European Championships and Cups have their organizers, or candidates. Now it is time to fill in those tournaments with teams. The registration process is now open and the deadline for entries is December 31 – more <u>here</u>.

Congress Invitation:

Let me invite you to Vilnius for the Congress, which will be held on February 8, 2020 – more <u>here</u>. I would like to recommend you to be a part of all Commissions, which is an integral part of the Congress. Except of the mandatory Commissions like Finance, Competition and Development, we will call a special Panel discussion on the topic of eligibility of the players and teams. The Netherlands and Italy will lead the discussion about eligibility of the players, members of the clubs and effectivity of PUPs for our Cups competitions. I was asked by many NFs about US players with European passport. I will bring some arguments about this issue based on experience of other European Federations. Do not miss these very important meetings. Program for Friday's Meetings will be sent in the beginning of January.
